



EDGE-PA: Empowering, Diversity, Growth, Excellence

A Pipeline Program for Groups Underrepresented in Medicine

Background

- There has been a 35 year overall declining trend of Black males in medicine. According to census data, Black or African Americans make up 13.4% of the US population. However, in 2018, PAEA reports showed that only 7.6% of all PA applicants of all gender identified as Black or African American. The same report showed that out of 27,283 applicants, only 520 (1.9%) identified as Black male. Among these Black males, only 86 (16.5%) matriculated to PA programs, compared to the overall 32.3% matriculation rate that year.
- This means that overall, only 0.32% of successfully matriculated applicants were Black men. This is despite 100% of the PA programs reporting that they received applications from African American candidates, although the PAEA report does not delineate the gender differences in this category. With these trends, the already low number of African American practicing PAs will continue to go down, as seen in the past NCCPA report (3.6% in 2016 to 3.3% in 2020).

Purpose:

 This pipeline program aims to increase the diversity of the PA profession.

Methodology:

- With the help of PAEA, we identified Black men that had mostly already applied to PA programs unsuccessfully. After an application process, we provided support and resources to the pre-PA students that is completely free, included:
- Mentorship with a Black PA
- Essay writing assistance
- CASPA Reviews
- Meeetings with different PA Program Admissions teams
- Meetings with PAEA's CASPA rep
- Meetings with the National Society of Black PAs
- Scholarship for CASPA fees
- Mock interviews
- Tutor Help
- Secure interview spots from PA Programs
- Osmosis subscription


