Background and Objectives

Background:

- PA-specific doctoral programs have gained traction in the U.S. over the past decade.¹⁻³
- Little is known about their structure and outcomes. Primary goals include enhancing knowledge and skills to advance the PA career in clinical, leadership, education and scholarship.
- Scholarly work improves job satisfaction and well-being for PAs.

Objectives:

- Investigate the trends and characteristics of the currently available PA-specific doctoral programs.
- Examine the delivery of research and scholarly education in these programs.

Methodology

- A mixed-methods study involving gualitative analysis and website searches for the characteristics of PA-specific doctoral programs.
- Data were triangulated by examining each program's public website and promotional materials.
- When data unavailable, information was requested via e-mail.
- 24 programs were identified & examined.

Results

Emerging characteristic themes among PA-specific doctoral programs







Prominent concentrations/ advanced clinical practic leadership education pu global health.

- Research related coursew ranged from 0-22 credit ho (mean 30.16%, median 3 total credit hours).
- There was significant va course titles, course descriptions, and expected outcomes across programs.

*Individual tracks were included in this analysis separately for programs with differing total and/or research related credit hours across different tracks.



	Conclusions
	 PA doctoral education is growing rapidly with the majority of currently available programs emphasizing leadership, academia, and clinical practice advancement.
100%	 Researchers became aware of 2 new programs after analyzing the data.
95.83% %	 Although research was stated as a goal for many programs, there is a lack of consistency in the delivery of this curricular element.
100%	 Future studies should correlate this data with graduate outcomes.
