How Often are PAs Changing Specialties?

One in five PAs has made a specialty change at some point in their career.



Why Do PAs Change Specialties?



3 in 10 PAs said their primary reason for changing their specialty was work life balance, and over 61% listed this motivation as a factor.

Other drivers were improved compensation, pursuing an opportunity to switch, following interests in other specialties, and seeking a better work environment.

Most PAs who changed specialties in 2023 were either early career (50.5%; 0-5 years) or mid-career (41.1%; 6-20 years).
