ALLERGY & IMMUNOLOGY PRIVILEGES

- Allergen immunotherapy via all therapeutic routes
- o Allergy testing; including blood (RAST), prick, and intradermal testing
- o Bronchial provocation testing for hyper-reactive airways
- Delayed hypersensitivity skin testing
- o Drug desensitization and challenge (e.g. venoms, biologicals, and medications)
- Exercise challenge testing
- o Immediate hypersensitivity skin testing
- Methacholine challenge testing
- Oral/food challenge testing
- Patch testing
- o Physical urticaria testing
- o Rapid desensitization for hypersensitivity (e.g. allergens, venoms, biologicals, and medication)
- Rhinolaryngoscopy

ANESTHESIA PRIVILEGES

- o Administer moderate conscious sedation
- Administer general anesthesia and adjuvant drugs
- o Administer regional anesthesia
- o Endotracheal intubation and extubation
- Insert and remove arterial lines

- o Perform and interpret radiologic, radionucleotide, and other imaging studies for diagnosis and treatment of endocrine and metabolic diseases
- o Perform and interpret stimulation and suppression tests
- Ultrasonography of the soft tissues of the neck

GASTROENTEROLOGY PRIVILEGES

- Colostomy management
- Endoscopy
- o Insert and remove gastrostomy/gastrojejunostomy/jejunostomy tubes
- Insert and remove nasogastric/feeding tubes
- Paracentesis
- o Percutaneous liver biopsy
- o Flexible sigmoidoscopy
- Rigid proctoscopy

HEMATOLOGY AND ONCOLOGY PRIVILEGES

- o Access and manage intraventricular catheter system (e.g. Ommaya reservoir)
- o Administer and supervise cellular therapy
- o Prescribe and manage oncolytic agents and biological response modifiers via all therapeutic routes
- Prescribe and manage chemotherapeutic agents via all therapeutic routes; including intrathecal via lumbar puncture and intraventricular reservoir
- o Bone marrow aspiration, biopsy, and harvest
- o Fine needle aspiration
- Interpret pathology reports
- o Lumbar puncture
- o Manage and remove indwelling venous access catheters
- Paracentesis
- o Supervise apheresis and plasmapheresis
- o Therapeutic phlebotomy
- Thoracentesis

INFECTIOUS DISEASE PRIVILEGES

- o Administer antimicrobial and biological products via all therapeutic routes
- Arthrocentesis and aspiration of fluid from joints, bursae, tenosynovial structures and other subcutaneous and musculoskeletal structures
- o Insert and remove arterial lines
- o Insert and remove central lines, with or without ultrasound guidance
- Lumbar puncture
- o Manage and remove indwelling venous access catheters
- Wound care and debridement

NEPHROLOGY PRIVILEGES

- Evaluate dialysis access
- Insert and remove arterial lines
- o Insert and remove central lines, with or without ultrasound guidance; including vascath placement
- o Insert and remove peritoneal dialysis catheters
- o Initiate and manage dialysis
- o Initiate and manage continuous renal replacement therapy
- o Peritoneal dialysis
- o Point of care ultrasound and doppler

NEONATOLOGY PRIVILEGES

- o Attendance at delivery to assume care of newborn
- Arterial puncture
- Chest tube insertion
- Endotracheal administration of surfactant
- Endotracheal intubation and extubation
- Insert and remove arterial lines
- o Insert and remove central lines, with or without ultrasound guidance
- Insert and remove suprapubic cystostomy/catheter
- o Insert and remove gastrostomy/gastrojejunostomy/jejunostomy tubes
- o Insert and remove urethral catheter

- Access and manage intraventricular catheter system (e.g. Ommaya reservoir)
- Apply skull tongs and fixation pins
- o Apply cervical halo
- o Insert and manage intracranial pressure monitors
- o Insert and remove external ventricular drains
- Lumbar puncture
- Manage lumbar CSF drains
- Myleography
- Opening and closing of the surgical incision
- o Perform nerve blocks

OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY PRIVILEGES

- Amniotomy

- Temporal artery biopsy

- Visual field testing

ORTHOPAEDIC PRIVILEGES

- Apply and adjust traction
- Arthrocentesis and aspiration of fluid from joints, bursae, tenosynovial structures and other subcutaneous and musculoskeletal structures
- o Compartment pressure measurement and management
- o Digital block and regional anesthesia
- Excision of cysts
- Inject joints, bursae, tenosynovial structures and entheses, and other cutaneous, subcutaneous and musculoskeletal structures
- Insert and remove surgical drains
- Opening and closing of the surgical incision
- Percutaneous pinning of fractures
- o Radiologic measurement of bone density

PAIN MANAGEMENT PRIVILEGES

- Manage Intrathecal pumps

PLASTIC AND RECONSTRUCTIVE SURGERY PRIVILEGES

- o Order voluntary and involuntary hospital admissions
- Perform psychiatric clearance for voluntary and involuntary admission to psychiatric in-patient and partial hospitalization
- o Perform biofeedback
- Perform psychiatric evaluations
- o Perform suicide risk assessment
- o Provide chemical dependency intervention and therapy
- o Provide individual, family, and group psychotherapy
- o Psychopharmacological management

PULMONARY PRIVILEGES

- o Administer moderate conscious sedation
- Arterial puncture
- o Bronchoscopy and bronchoalveolar lavage

- o Administer intrathecal chemotherapy by lumbar puncture
- o Administer moderate conscious sedation
- Administer and monitor radionucleotide treatment
- o Fistulogram
- Fluoroscopy
- Insert and remove arterial lines
- Insert and remove central lines, with or without ultrasound guidance; including vascath placement
- Therapeutic administration of nuclear medicine
- o Ultrasound-guided biopsy

RHEUMATOLOGY PRIVILEGES

- Administer and monitor chemotherapeutic agents, immunosuppressive therapy, and biologics via all therapeutic routes
- Arthrocentesis and aspiration of fluid from joints, bursae, tenosynovial structures and other subcutaneous and musculoskeletal structures
- Inject joints, bursae, tenosynovial structures and entheses, and other cutaneous, subcutaneous and musculoskeletal structures
- o Perform crystal identification via microscopic analysis
- o Perform fine needle aspiration, with or without ultrasound guidance.
- Perform punch and needle biopsies

SURGERY PRIVILEGES

- Administer moderate conscious sedation
- Apply external fixation
- o Apply and manage negative pressure therapy (i.e. wound vacuum)
- o Burn care and management
