Goldberger, AL, et al. *Clinical Electrocardiography, A Simplified Approach*. Mosby, 2017 9th ed (\$55.00). Excellent text for the beginner, easy to read and complete enough to be used as a reference. Each chapter has review questions and ECGs at the end.

Grauer, K. *A Practical Guide to ECG Interpretation*. Mosby, 1998, 2nd ed (<\$10.00 used). Good text for the beginner, lots of simple explanations, examples and review ECGs. Easy to follow format and style. Expands into rhythm strip analysis. Excellent text! May be only available used.

Thaler, MS. *The Only EKG Book You'll Ever Need*. JB Lippincott, 2018, 9th ed (\$61.00). Easy to read and understand. Utilizes good examples and covers all important ECG and rhythm information. Downside, not many practice strips or ECGs, no references listed.

Shade and Wesley. *Fast & Easy ECGs: A self-paced learning program*. McGraw Hill 2012 (2nd ed.) (\$83.00). A great text for those who like the do-it-yourself book. Well illustrated, easy to read and follow, colorful with good practice examples.

Huff, J., et al. *ECG Workout: Exercises in Arrhythmia Interpretation*. JB Lippincott, 2016, 7th ed (\$60.00). Excellent book to practice rhythm disturbances. List identifying ECG characteristics in well organized fashion and has hundreds of practice strips. Excellent!!

Garcia, TB. *12-Lead ECG: The Art of Interpretation*. Jones and Bartlett, 2013, 2nd ed. (\$71.00 new). Excellent book covering only 12-lead interpretation. Contains 200+ full-size ECGs complete with good analysis and background. Easy to read, well organized, and full of useful information. Excellent!

Mattu, A, Tabas, JA, Brady, WJ. *Electrocardiography in Emergency, Acute, and Critical Care*. American College of Emergency Physicians, 2019, 2nd ed. (\$199.00). For the more advanced student. Well defined evidence-based, scenario-based chapters which provide in-depth discussion of relevant clinical questions. Expensive, but worth the money for those wishing more understanding and application.

Muniz, J. *Sparkson's Illustrated Guide to ECG Interpretation*. Medcomic, 2020, 2nd ed. (\$40.00). Easy to follow, well-illustrated, accurate, and fun way to learn ECGs. Not much in the way of practice examples of rhythm strips or 12-leads, a few but not the focus of this book.
