# Several treatments can help manage JIA:



Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs)

- Naproxen
- Meloxicam
- Celecoxib



#### Disease-modifying antirheumatic drugs (DMARDs)

- Methotrexate
- Sulfasalazine
- Leflunomide



### **Biologic DMARDs**

- Etanercept
- Adalimumab
- Abatacept
- Tocilizumab
- Anakinra
- Canakinumab
