Other ATLS course offerings limit "physician extenders" to auditing the course or do not allow their participation at all. Typically, auditing does not include skill stations or the exam. As with physicians, PAs who register and complete the full course will receive an ATLS provider card documenting that they attended the course in its entirety. They also will receive a CME "certificate of attendance" documenting their attendance, the location, and the date(s) of the course. In addition to the student course, instructor and refresher courses are also available.
