This case-based session demonstrates a systematic method for evaluating lower extremity alignment in
children.
Trauma Management in Wilderness/Austere Environments
This session reviews the different types of trauma algorithms (ATLS, MARCH, AAABBBCCC), their functionality
and limitations.
Travel Medicine: A Dose of Prevention
This session is designed to help providers understand the health issues of their traveling patients before
travel and upon return.

Treating Hypertensive Urgencies and Emergencies: What the New Guidelines Tell Us The session focuses on the management of specific clinical entities associated with hypertensive emergencies. **Understanding Common Nephrology Cases** This case-based session covers a broad range of complex nephrology cases. Update in Hospital Medicine: Recent Literature Impacting Clinical Practice in the Inpatient Setting This session uses a systematic method to comb the medical literature to identify the most relevant published literature that impacted the practice of hospital medicine over the last 12-18 months. **Update on Breast Cancer** This session includes discussion about the epidemiology of breast cancer in the U.S. and globally, the disparities in diagnosis and mortality, and the current state of the evidence regarding histology and treatment options. **Update: Management of Venous Thromboembolism** This session provides the tools needed to appropriately care for patients presenting with VTE disease. **Updates in Anticoagulation and Transfusion Medicine** This session covers current anticoagulation medications and indications. **Updates in Lung Cancer Staging and Molecular Testing** This session provides the basics of the updated staging system and highlight the changes for the staging of lung cancer. **Updates in Managing COPD** This case-based session addresses how to correctly interpret spirometry, reviews the signs and symptoms of COPD, and utilizes the GOLD Guidelines to make the correct diagnosis. USS: Building the Bench: Junior PA Mentorship Program and the Council of Junior PAs The session covers developing and establishing a mentorship program tailored to the geographically diverse population of military PAs. USS: Expanding Opportunities for PAs in the Military Health System and Beyond The session begins with a brief overview of military PA history and traditional roles. It then outlines the expanding roles of PAs, including leadership, healthcare administration, policy development, and collaborative partnerships with industry. USS: Is There a Fracture? Orthopaedic Evaluation and Treatment of Polytrauma Patients This session covers orthopaedic management of trauma patients. USS: The Future of the Military Health System and the National Defense Authorization Act This session provides an overview of the current and future state of the MHS and services' medical assets, resources, and missions. USS: Transforming Government Healthcare Organizations with Lean Daily Management This session describes the ongoing cultural transformation of a medical center from traditional management on the journey to lean daily management and provide healthcare leaders an introduction to this proven management discipline. USS: U.S. Military PA Panel: Where Do We See Ourselves in the Next 50 Years and Beyond? This session addresses U.S. military PA history and current status of U.S. military PAs. Walking the Talk: Creating the Space for Engaged LGBTQ Care This session addresses how the use of language--both verbal and non-verbal--contributes to creating the space needed to competently care for individuals who are socially marginalized due to their sexual orientation and/or gender identity.
